
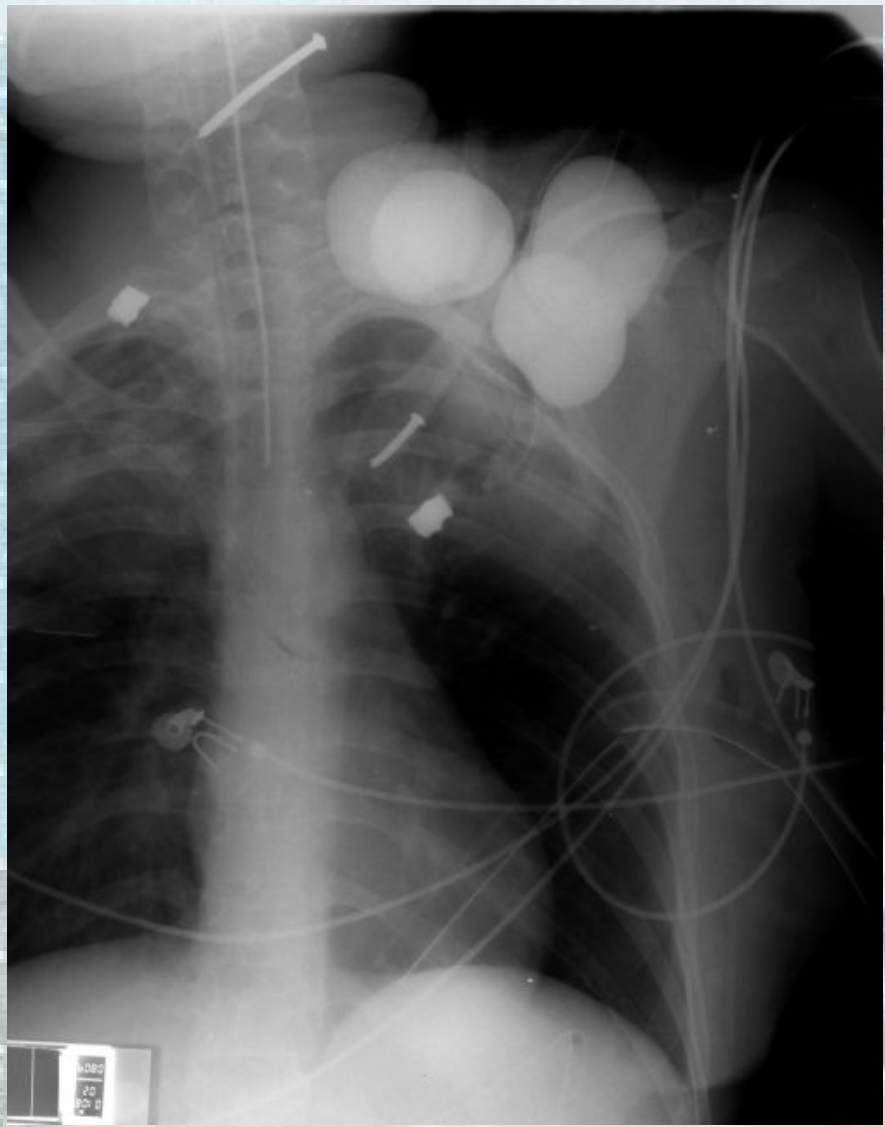


Mass Casualty/Terror Workshop

- No where in the world other than here can one discuss with the world's experts on their experiences with victims of multi Mass Casualty and Terror Incidents

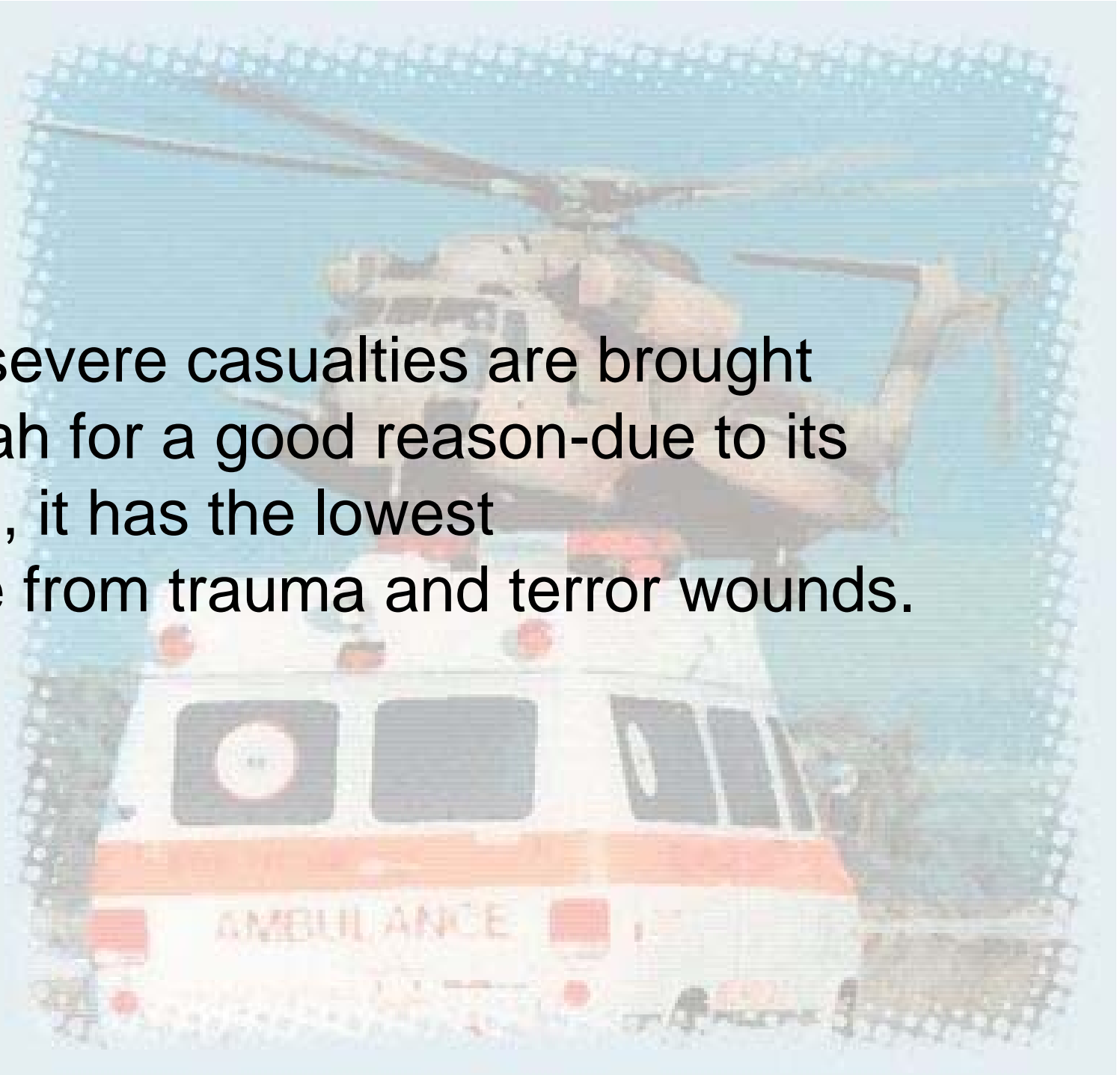


It is no wonder that the most seriously injured patients are brought to HMO and it is no surprise that the chances of healing and recovery are improved. The trauma unit admits 2000 casualties a year. From the 8500 casualties of terror since September 2000- Hadassah took care of 3000 terror victims (40%) of the total.



Chest Xray with penetrating multi-shrapnel in terror victim

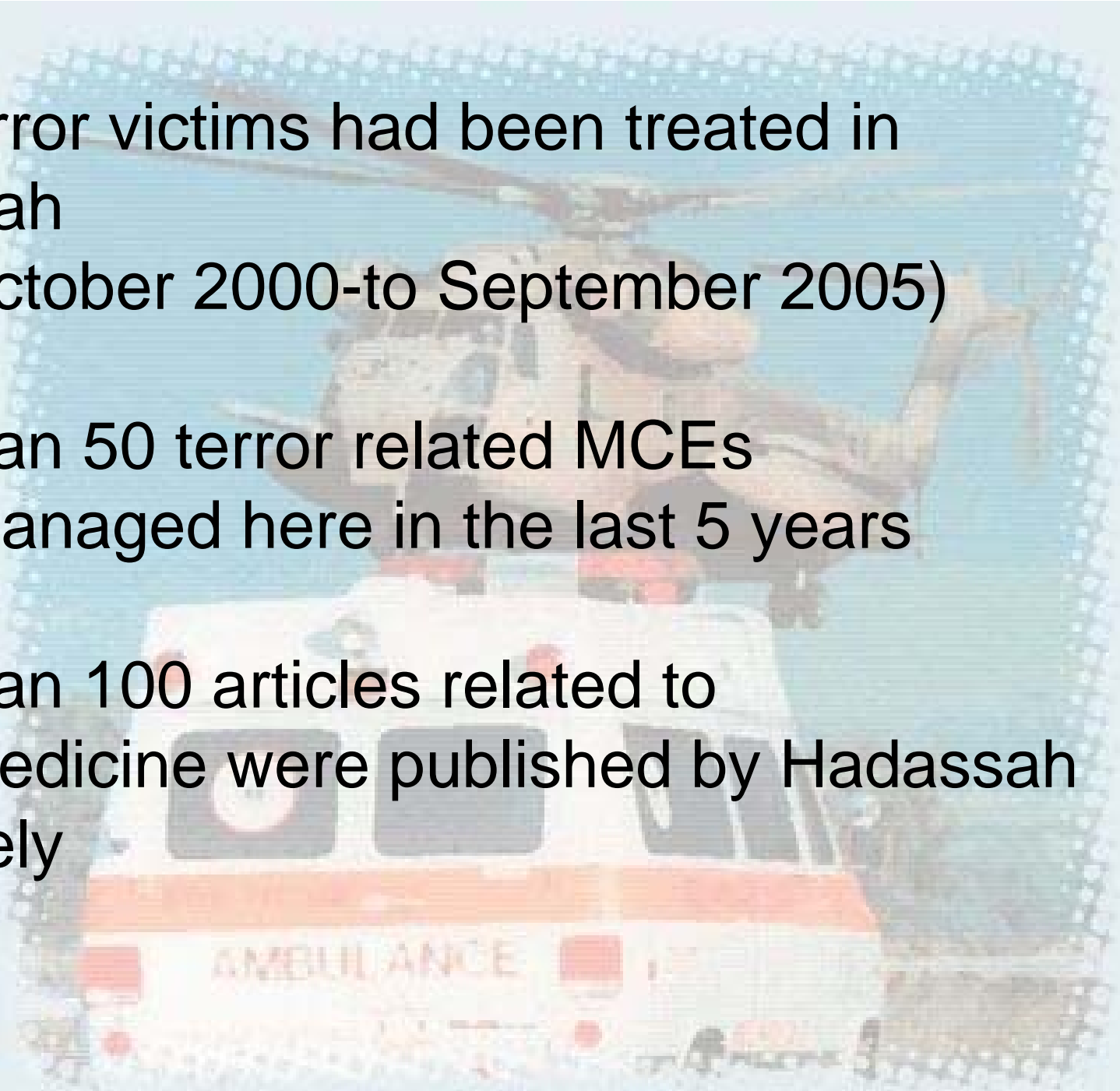
The most severe casualties are brought to Hadassah for a good reason-due to its Excellence, it has the lowest fatality rate from trauma and terror wounds.

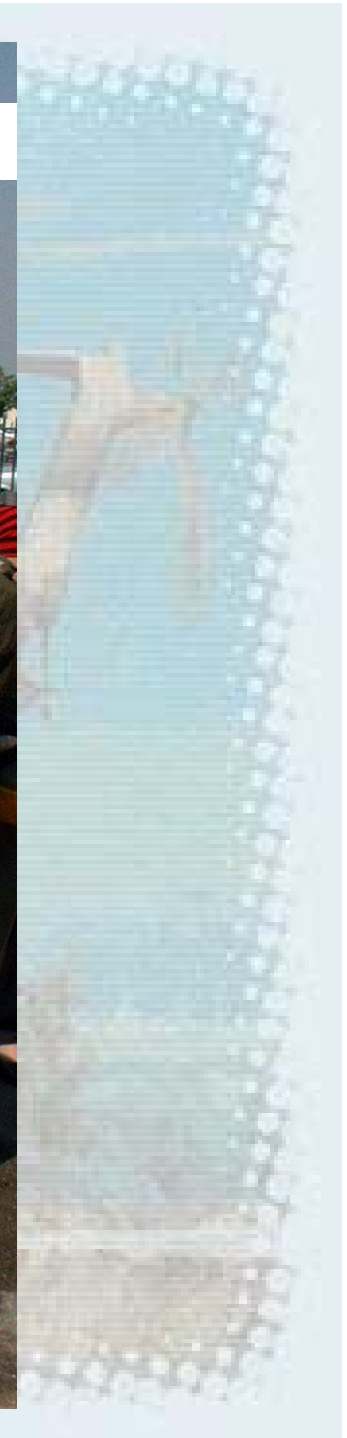

Professor Shmuel Shapira MD, MPH

Professor Shmuel Shapira is currently the Deputy Director General of the Hadassah Medical Organization. Prior to this position, he served as Deputy Director of Hadassah Ein Kerem University Hospital.

Professor Shapira received his medical degree from the Hadassah-Hebrew University School of Medicine He completed two residencies in anesthesiology/intensive care and in medical management, also at Hadassah, as well as advanced training in pain management.

In 1992, he completed advanced training in obstetric anesthesia at the University of California, San Francisco.

Prof Shapira is Lieutenant Colonel (Res) in the IDF.

Prof. Shapira serves as authority on terror, trauma & emergency medicine

and instructs medical students and physicians in terror medicine, management of mass casualty's events, advanced trauma life support and risk management. Prof Shapira is active in several

Ministry of Health National committees and councils and used to be a board member of Magen David Adom (Israel's Emergency Medical Service-EMS) and chair the Medical and Emergency Preparedness Committee of Magen David Adom.
